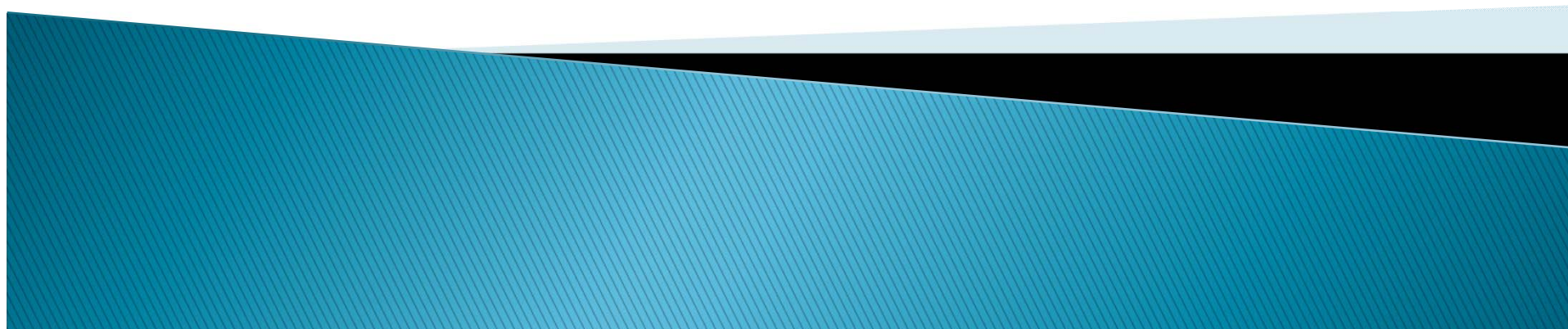

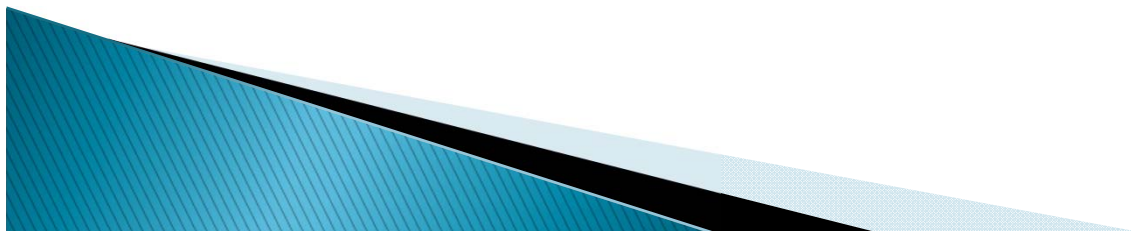

Aims

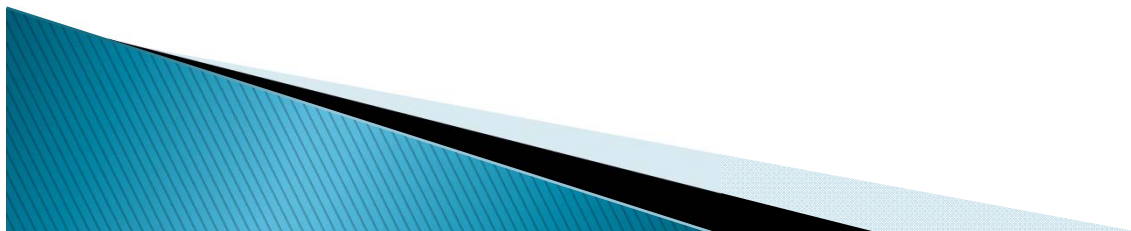


- ▶ How we deliver reading at school.

What we'll send home

- ▶ Reading records for every child
- ▶ Reading book or reading activity
- ▶ Please keep both in the book bag at all times



How we deliver reading



- ▶ Look at cover, pictures etc.
- ▶ Tune into sounds– ‘*what can you see?*’
- ▶ Blending title (reading)
- ▶ Flick through book, look at pictures
- ▶ Orally tell story– language development time
- ▶ Finally read book (or part of book)
 - ▶ All should take less than 10 mins

Reading time



- ▶ Children hold book
- ▶ Minimal distractions eg; TV, dog, radio etc.
- ▶ Sitting in an upright comfortable position
- ▶ Clear expectations this is reading time– *not a request!*

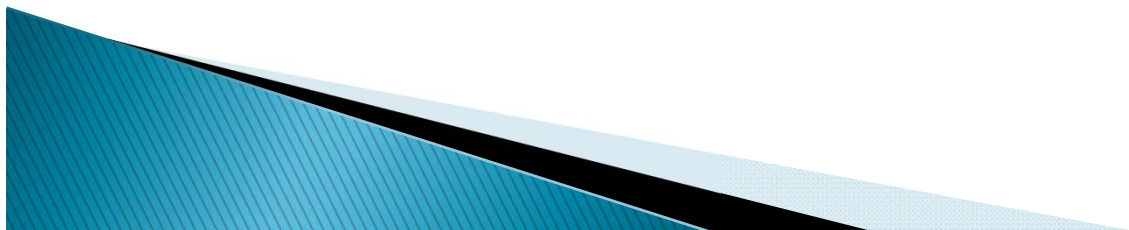


What to do



- Record every time you read with your child

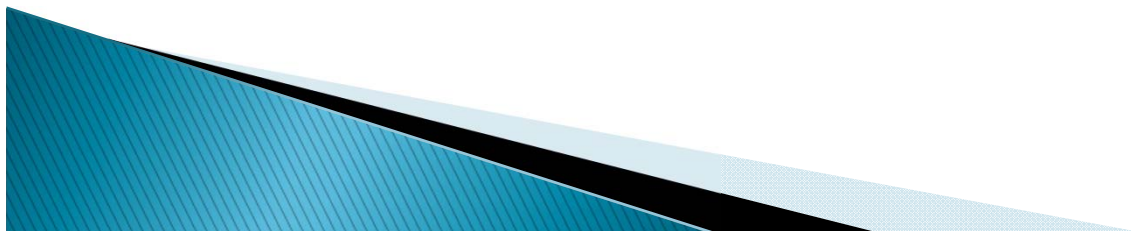
27/11	Jen and the Big Egg	She struggled reading 'hatch'. Good attempt at reading the word 'the'.
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Supporting Home Learning



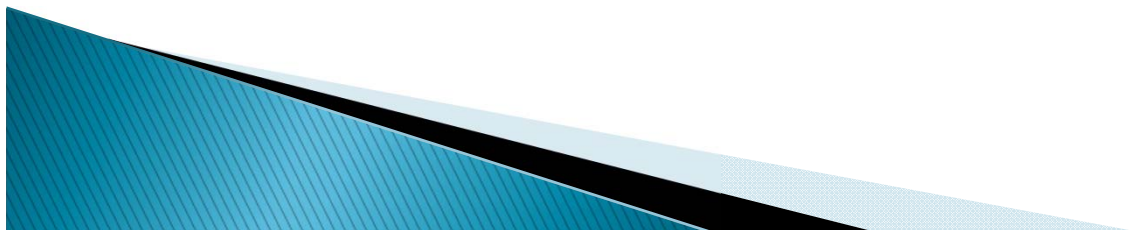
- ▶ Ideally reading/home learning for 5–10 minutes, 4 times a week.
- ▶ We will send home one letter a term to say how many times you have read with your child, taken from the reading record.
- ▶ Reminders in a letter if your child hasn't read for over a week.



How we teach Phonics



- ▶ Follow letters and sounds—all online
- ▶ Broken down into phases.
- ▶ Phase 2
 - s, a, t, p
 - i, n, m, d
 - g, o, c, k
 - ck, e, u, r
 - h, b, f, ff, l, ll, ss
- ▶ Children learn actions for the sounds.
- ▶ Referred to as sounds rather than letters.

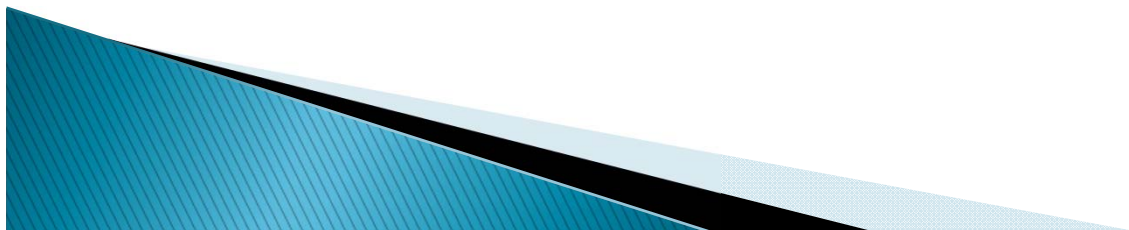


How we teach Phonics

 - Robot arms



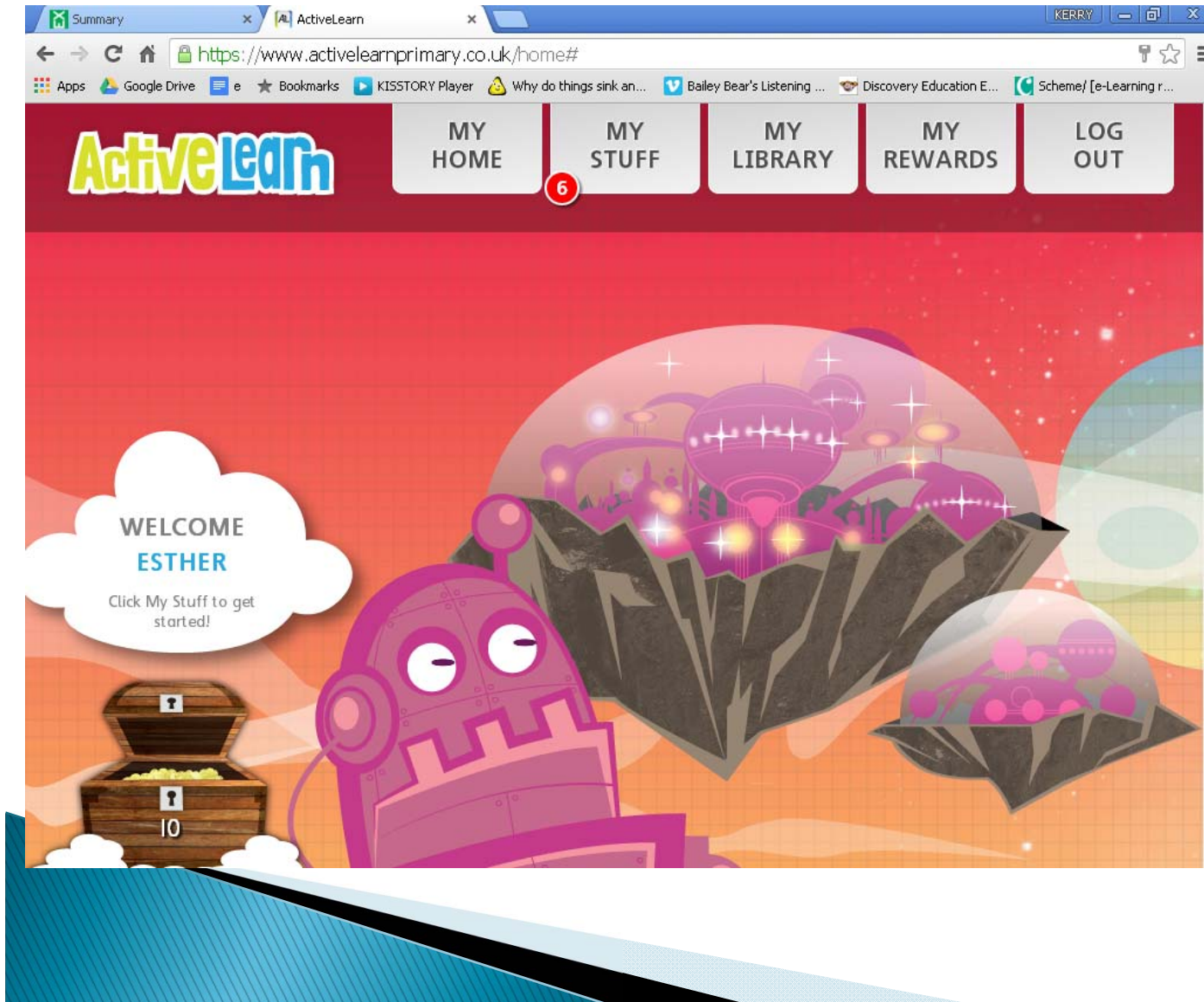
