How will improvements be sustainable in the future?

Beacon Rise Primary School ensures children are receiving PE and sporting opportunities in accordance with government recommended guidelines. Beacon Rise will continue to invest in Head of Sport roles to ensure continuity and assessment in quality of teaching of all staff.

Through school-led training and CSET CPD opportunities, staff are able to continually develop their confidence in planning and teaching PE.

Continued investment in the CSET sports partnership and South Gloucestershire PE Association will enable Team BR to maximise non-competitive and competitive participation for our children. Because of this, children have access to a wide range of extra-curricular clubs and competition entries to further support their opportunities for physical activity, thus maintaining the high profile of TeamBR regionally and within school.

School continue to adhere to the OPAL Primary Programme and Active Play thus ensuring all children have the access to wide-ranging resources to be active at play times; the school currently holds the Platinum Play Award. In addition, a dedicated lunch time Play Leader has been appointed and will be responsible for promoting active play, alongside Year 5 and 6 Wellbeing Leaders who are trained by CSET to independently provide targeted sporting provision for all children.

Beacon Rise continues to use the School Games Mark award as a tool to ensure our sports and active provision is maintained at the highest level. We currently hold the Platinum School Games Mark.
